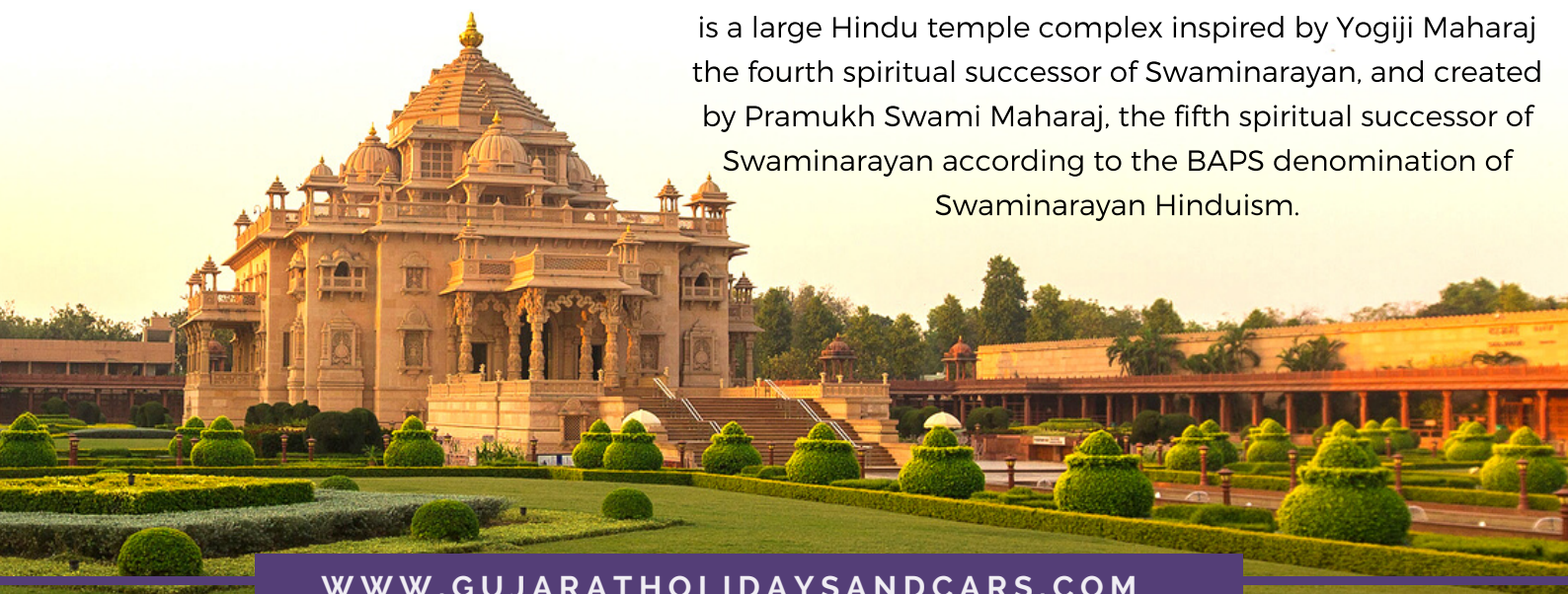
TOP ATTRACTIONS IN AHMEDABAD

MOST POPULAR TOURIST PLACES & ATTRACTIONS IN AND AROUND AHMEDABAD, GUJARAT

Ahmedabad, in western India, is the largest city in the state of Gujarat. The Sabarmati River runs through its center. On the western bank is the Gandhi Ashram at Sabarmati, which displays the spiritual leader's living quarters and artifacts. Across the river, the Calico Museum of Textiles, once a cloth merchant's mansion, has a significant collection of antique and modern fabrics.

AKSHARDHAM

Swaminarayan Akshardham in Gandhinagar, Gujarat, India is a large Hindu temple complex inspired by Yogiji Maharaj the fourth spiritual successor of Swaminarayan, and created by Pramukh Swami Maharaj, the fifth spiritual successor of Swaminarayan according to the BAPS denomination of Swaminarayan Hinduism.





KANKARIYA LAKE

Kankaria Lake is the second largest lake in Ahmedabad, Gujarat, India. It is located in the south-eastern part of the city, in the Maninagar area. It was completed in 1451 during the reign of Sultan Qutb-ud-Din Ahmad Shah II though its origin is placed in the Chaulukya period sometimes.

SARKHEJ ROZA

Sarkhej Roza is a mosque and tomb complex located in the village of Makarba, 7 km south-west of Ahmedabad in Gujarat state, India. Although there are many rozas across Gujarat, the Sarkhej Roza is the most revered.



ADALAJ STEP WELL

Adalaj Stepwell or Rudabai Stepwell is a stepwell located in the village of Adalaj, close to Ahmedabad city and in Gandhinagar district in the Indian state of Gujarat, and considered a fine example of Indian architecture work. It was built in 1498 in the memory of Rana Veer Singh, by his wife Queen Rudadevi.

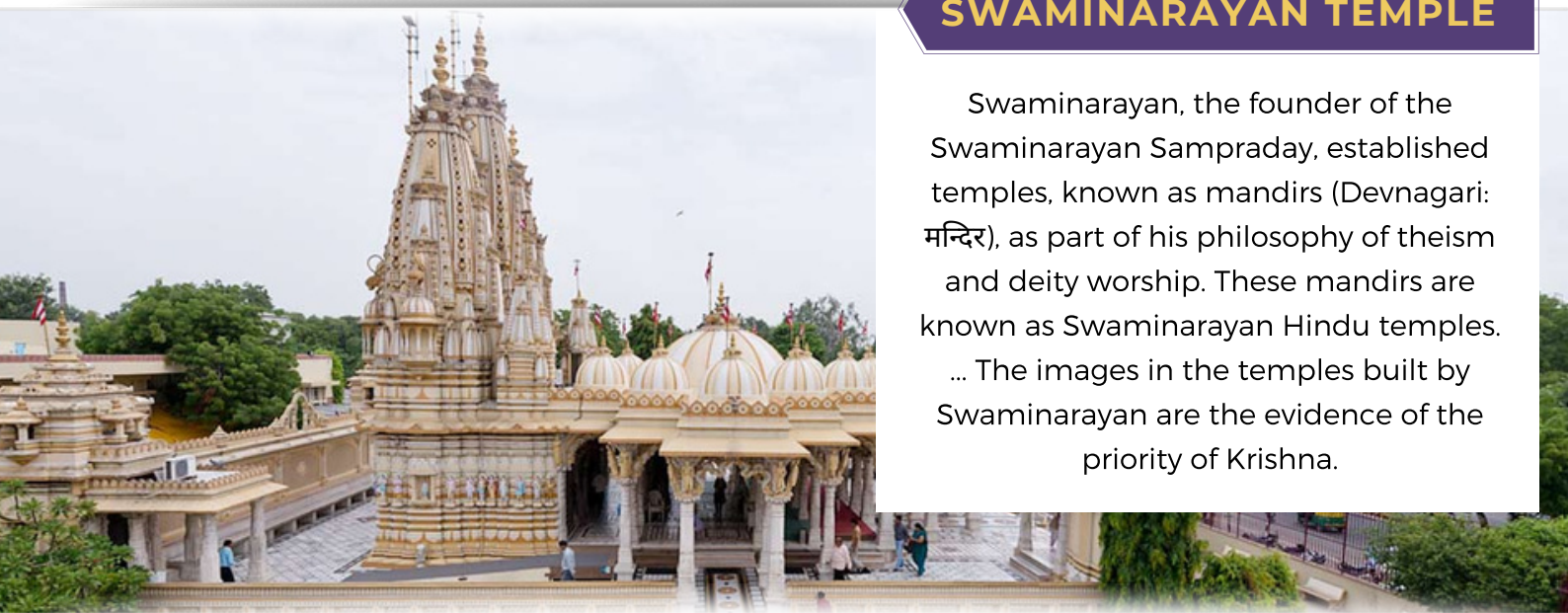
HUTHEESING JAIN TEMPLE

The construction of the temple was initiated originally planned by Shet Hathisinh Kesarisinh, a wealthy Ahmedabad trader who died at 49. The construction was supervised and completed by his wife Shethani Harkunvar. The temple is dedicated to Lord Dharmanatha, the fifteenth Jain Tirthankar.



SWAMINARAYAN TEMPLE

Swaminarayan, the founder of the Swaminarayan Sampraday, established temples, known as mandirs (Devnagari: मन्दिर), as part of his philosophy of theism and deity worship. These mandirs are known as Swaminarayan Hindu temples. ... The images in the temples built by Swaminarayan are the evidence of the priority of Krishna.



RIVERFRONT PARK

The Riverfront Park (1.2 Km long and width ranging from 30-60 mts) is located along Sabarmati River in Ahmedabad, India. The levels of the park are modulated so as to provide uninterrupted views of the river. A continuous Riverside Promenade was designed and its levels carefully planned, keeping the view aspects in mind.





JAMNAGAR

TOP PLACES TO VISIT IN JAMNAGAR

JAMNAGAR USUALLY REQUIRES 1-2 DAYS TO VISIT THE MOST IMPORTANT ATTRACTIONS

Jamnagar is a city in the western Indian state of Gujarat. On an island in Lakhota Lake, Lakhota Palace and Museum is a former fort that exhibits weapons, sculptures and pottery from the 9th to 18th centuries. At Bala Hanuman Temple, the Rama Naam prayer has been chanted continuously since 1964. To the northeast, the marshlands of Khijadiya Bird Sanctuary attract spotted deer, painted storks and migratory birds.

LAKHOTA LAKE

Lakhota Talav is one of the most beautiful and serene places of Jamnagar. Being right in the middle of the hustle and bustle of the city, the lake stands as the perfect picture of serenity. It is also known as the Ranmal Lake and surrounds Lakhota Fort, which is situated in an island inside.



BALA HANUMAN TEMPLE

Bala Hanuman Temple, also known as Shri Balahanuman Sankirtan Mandir is situated at the south east side of Ranmal Lake (or Lakhota Lake) in Jamnagar. Dedicated to Lord Hanuman, the temple is separated from the lake by a wide road. The simple looking structure houses the idols of Lord Ram, Lord Lakshman, Goddess Sita and Lord Hanuman.



LAKHOTA MUSEUM

Located in the picturesque setting of a surrounding lake, Lakhota Palace and Museum offers many reasons for visitation. Firstly, you would fall in love with its beauty. The huge palace is built on a lake island and offers the gems of sheer visual treat. Secondly, with facilities like a paved jogging track around the lake, Lakhota Palace and Museum is a preferred destination for all fitness freaks and anyone who wants to take a relaxing stroll around the beautiful lake.



DWARKA

DWARKA CITY IN GUJARAT FOR SPIRITUALITY, MYSTICISM,
AND HINDU MYTHOLOGY BEST FOR TRAVEL PLANS

Dwarka is an ancient city in the northwestern Indian state of Gujarat. It's known as a Hindu pilgrimage site. The ancient Dwarkadhish Temple has an elaborately tiered main shrine, a carved entrance and a black-marble idol of Lord Krishna. Dwarka Beach and nearby Dwarka Lighthouse offer views of the Arabian Sea. Southeast, Gaga Wildlife Sanctuary protects migratory birds and endangered species like the Indian wolf.

BET DWARKA

Bet Dwarka or Shankhodhar is an inhabited island at mouth of the Gulf of Kutch situated 3 km off the coast of Okha, Gujarat, India. The island measured northwest to southeast in 13 km long with an average east-west width of 4 km. It is a strip of sand and stone situated 30 km north of the town of Dwarka.



NAGESHWAR TEMPLE

Nageshwar Temple situated in Dwarka is one of the 12 Jyotirlingas in India. It is located on the route between Gomati Dwarka and the Bait Dwarka Island on the coast of Saurashtra in Gujarat. Also sometimes known as Nagnath Temple, the main deity here is Lord Shiva, also known as Nageshwar Mahadev.



THE RUKMINI TEMPLE

The Rukmini Devi Temple is a temple in Dwarka, 2 kilometers away from Dwarka, Gujarat, India. It is dedicated to Goddess Rukmini. The temple is said to be 2,500 years old but in its present form, it is inferred to belong to the 12th century.

GOPI TALAV

Gopi Talav is a lake in the Gopipura locality in the city of Surat in Gujarat state of India. It was built in circa 1510 CE by Malik Gopi, who was an affluent merchant and governor of Surat during the Mughal Empire. In 2012, the lake was renovated by Surat Municipal Corporation and the area surrounding it was redeveloped as a recreational facility.





SOMNATH

SOMNATH IS AN ANCIENT TEMPLE TOWN

SOMNATH IS AN ANCIENT TEMPLE TOWN IN THE STATE OF GUJARAT LOCATED IN PRABHAS PATAN IN SAURASHTRA.

The temple city of Somnath or Prabhas Patan is situated in the state of Gujarat on the Arabian Sea. The place extends from latitude 21° 04' in the north to longitude 70° 26' in the east.

Somnath celebrates a large fair on the day of the full moon of Kartik Purnima in November/December. Maha Shivratri in the month of March is also a major festival here.



SOMNATH TEMPLE

The Somnath temple (also known as the Deo Patan) located in Prabhas Patan near Veraval in Saurashtra on the western coast of Gujarat, India is believed to be the first among the twelve jyotirlinga shrines of Shiva. It is an important pilgrimage and tourist spot in Gujarat.

BHALKA TIRTHA

Bhalka Tirtha (Bhalka Pilgrimage) (Hindi: भालका तीर्थ), located in the Veraval in Saurashtra on the western coast of Gujarat, India, is the place where Krishna was hit by an arrow shot by a hunter named Jara, after which he is said to have left the earth for the heavenly abode, an act referred to in the Puranas as Shri Krishna Nijdam Prasthan Leela (Sanskrit: श्री कृष्ण नीजधाम प्रस्थान लीला).



TRIVENI GHAT

At a distance of 1 km from Somnath Temple and 2 km from Somnath Railway Station, Triveni Ghat is a holy place located in the pilgrimage town of Somnath. Situated near Somnath Beach, it is one of the most important holy places in Somnath.

Also known as Triveni Sangam, Triveni Ghat is the meeting place of three rivers Hiran, Kapila and Saraswati and then empties together into the Arabian Sea.





DIU

TOP PLACES TO VISIT IN DIU, INDIA

DIU IS A CHARMING BEACH RESORT TOWN CONNECTED TO GUJARAT AS AN ISLAND PARADISE BY A CREEK.

Diu is a coastal town at the eastern end of Diu Island, India. A bridge connects the island to the state of Gujarat. Overlooking the Arabian Sea, Diu Fort, a 16th-century Portuguese citadel, features a lighthouse and cannons. Inland, centuries-old St. Paul's Church was built in elaborate baroque style. Nearby, whitewashed St. Thomas Church is now home to the Diu Museum, with wooden carvings and religious artifacts.

ST. PAUL'S CHURCH

The St. Paul's Church, is situated on Diu Island, on the west coast of India, a Union Territory of India. Diu came under the control of Portuguese colonists in early 16th century. The St. Paul's Church, named after St. Paul, the Apostle of Jesus also known as the Apostle to the Gentiles, is still a functioning church and one of the three churches in Diu built by the Portuguese.



ST. THOMAS CHURCH MUSEUM

One of the major relics of the colonial past of India, St. Thomas Church is a Gothic-style church is an imposing structure that dots the beautiful town of Diu. The pristine white walls of the church are enough to draw tourists from all over the country to Diu. This gigantic church, originally built in 1598, has now been acquired by the government authorities and has been converted into a museum, doubling up as a repository of archaeological findings.



DIU FORT

The Diu Fortress, is a Portuguese-built fortification located on the west coast of India in Diu.

The fortress was built as part of Portuguese India's defensive fortifications at the eastern tip of the island of Diu during the 16th century.



NAGAO BEACH

Nagoa Beach is a town in Diu district, India, on the edge of the Junagadh district. The town's main industry is tourism, and it has 21 kilometers of coastline.

The population is 14,000 but about 40,000 tourists enter the town during peak seasons.





GIR NATIONAL PARK

Gir Forest National Park is a wildlife sanctuary in Gujarat, western India. It was established to protect Asiatic lions, who frequent the fenced-off Devalia Safari Park, along with leopards and antelopes.

Gir Jungle Trail, outside the fenced area, traverses deciduous forest and is home to wildlife including vultures and pythons.



The Kamleshwar Dam has marsh crocodiles and birds, such as Indian skimmers and pelicans.





BHAVNAGAR

Bhavnagar is a city in the Bhavnagar district of the Saurashtra region of Gujarat, a state of India. It was founded in 1724 by Bhavsinhji Gohil

SHREE TAKHTESHWAR TEMPLE



Commissioned by Maharaja Takhtsinhji in the 1893 AD, Takhteshwar temple is one of the oldest temples in Gujarat. Takhteshwar temple is perched on a hillock boasts finest Gujarat style of architecture making it one of the most appealing temples in Bhavnagar. Supported on 18 ornately carved pillars, the temple has a beautiful main hall, featuring a three-eyed Lord Shiva idol.

NISHKALANK MAHADEV

At a distance of 28 km from Bhavnagar Railway Station, Nishkalank Mahadev Temple is a Hindu temple located at Koliyak near Bhavnagar, Gujarat.

Situated in Koliyak Beach, it is one of the rarest sea temples in India you must include in your Gujarat trip and among the most visited places of pilgrimage in Bhavnagar.





RAJKOT

Rajkot is the fourth-largest city in the state of Gujarat, India, after Ahmedabad, Surat, and Vadodara, and is in the center of the Saurashtra region of Gujarat.

WATSON MUSEUM



The Watson Museum, considered to be one of the best among the seven such museums located across Saurashtra and managed by the Gujarat State Government, it has collections of precious objects from the princely State of Rajkot founded by the Jadeja Rajputs.

KABA GANDHI NO DELO

Kaba Gandhi No Delo, Rajkot was Indian leader Mahatma Gandhi's primary family home in India until 1915, including during those years when he stayed in London and in South Africa. Later on, on return from South Africa in 1915, he established Kocharab Ashram in Ahmedabad.



BHUJ

Bhuj is a Municipality and District Headquarter of Kutch District in the state of Gujarat, India.

Bhuj is known as a desert city, with a history dating back to kingdoms and empires, palaces from the rule of the Naga chiefs, the Jadeja Rajputs, the Gujarat Sultans and the British Raj. With numerous temples, small streets, and traditional handicrafts, Bhuj is one of the unique historical sites in India.

AJARAKHPUR

In the desert city of Bhuj, lies an art and craft village called Ajrakhpur. The place is known for its Ajrakh print (block printing on cloth) all over the world. Located at a distance of 15 kilometers from the city of Bhuj,

Ajrakhpur is known worldwide for the art of Ajrakh, block-printing uses colors derived from nature, such as indigo, henna, turmeric, pomegranate, iron, and mud. In some cases, the fabrics are washed up to 20 times.



BHUJODI

A small town, located 8km southeast of Bhuj, Bhujodi is one of the major textile and craft hubs of the region, and a veritable draw for the traveller. A large part of the Vankar community resides here.

These are specialists in weaving, tie and dye and other craft forms that make the backbone of Kutch's handicraft scene. There are specific craft and arts centers around Bhujodi.



PRAG MAHAL PALACE

The Prag Mahal is a 19th-century palace located next to the Aina Mahal in Bhuj, Gujarat, India.

Prag Mahal is named after Rao Pragmalji II, who commissioned it and construction began in 1865. It was designed by Colonel Henry Saint Wilkins in what the local tourist office describes as the Italian Gothic style,



AAINA MAHAL PALACE



The Aina Mahal is an 18th-century palace that is located next to the Prag Mahal in Darbargadh, Bhuj, Gujarat, India. The palace was built by Rao Lakhpatji of Cutch State around 1750. The fabulous Aina Mahal is a part of the extravagant Darbargadh Palace of Bhuj.

KUTCH MUSEUM

Kutch Museum in Bhuj is the oldest museum of Gujarat. It is located opposite Hamirsar Lake in Bhuj, Kutch, Gujarat, India. The museum was earlier known as Fergusson Museum.

Kutch museum was initially formed as a part of the School of Arts established by Khengarji III, the Maharao of Cutch State. It was founded on 1 July 1877



SUMRASAR VILLAGE

The village of Samrasar Sheikh is located at a distance of 25 kilometres from Bhuj. It is inhabited by people who are famous around the world for their handiwork. There is a trust body named Kala Raksha Trust, which is working towards preservation of the Kutch arts, especially Suf, Rabari, and Garasia Jat embroideries.



LUDIYA VILLAGE

Ludiya village is located in Bhuj Tehsil of Kachchh district in Gujarat, India. It is situated 75km away from Bhuj, which is both district & sub-district headquarter of Ludiya village. Ludiya has a total population of 2,009 peoples. There are about 420 houses in Ludiya village. Bhuj is nearest town to Ludiya which is approximately 75km away.

KHAVDA VILLAGE

Khavda is a village in Bhuj Taluka of Kutch district of Gujarat, India. It lies on the west side of Pachham Island in Greater Rann of Kutch. Khavda village is located in Bhuj Tehsil of Kachchh district in Gujarat, India. It is situated 70km away from Bhuj, which is both district & sub-district headquarter of Khavda village.



KALO DUNGAR

Kalo Dungar or Black Hill is the highest point in Kutch, Gujarat, India, at 462 m. It is located 97 km from the District headquarters of Bhuj and 25 km from the nearest town Khavda.

This is probably the only place in Kachchh from where a panoramic view of the Great Rann of Kutch is possible.



DHANETA JATS



The Jats of Kutch are a cattle breeding nomadic Muslim community, found in the Kutch region of Gujarat in India. They are one of a number of communities of Maldhari pastoral nomads found in the Banni region of Kutch.

DHORDO

Dhordo is a small village located in Kutch district, Gujarat, India. This village is situated within Bhuj taluk on the edge of the India-Pakistan border and is around 86 KM from Bhuj. The village is home to an annual 3-month festival called 'Rann Utsav.'



STATUE OF UNITY



The Statue of Unity is located 90 km from Vadodara, 150 km from Surat, and 200 km from Ahmedabad.

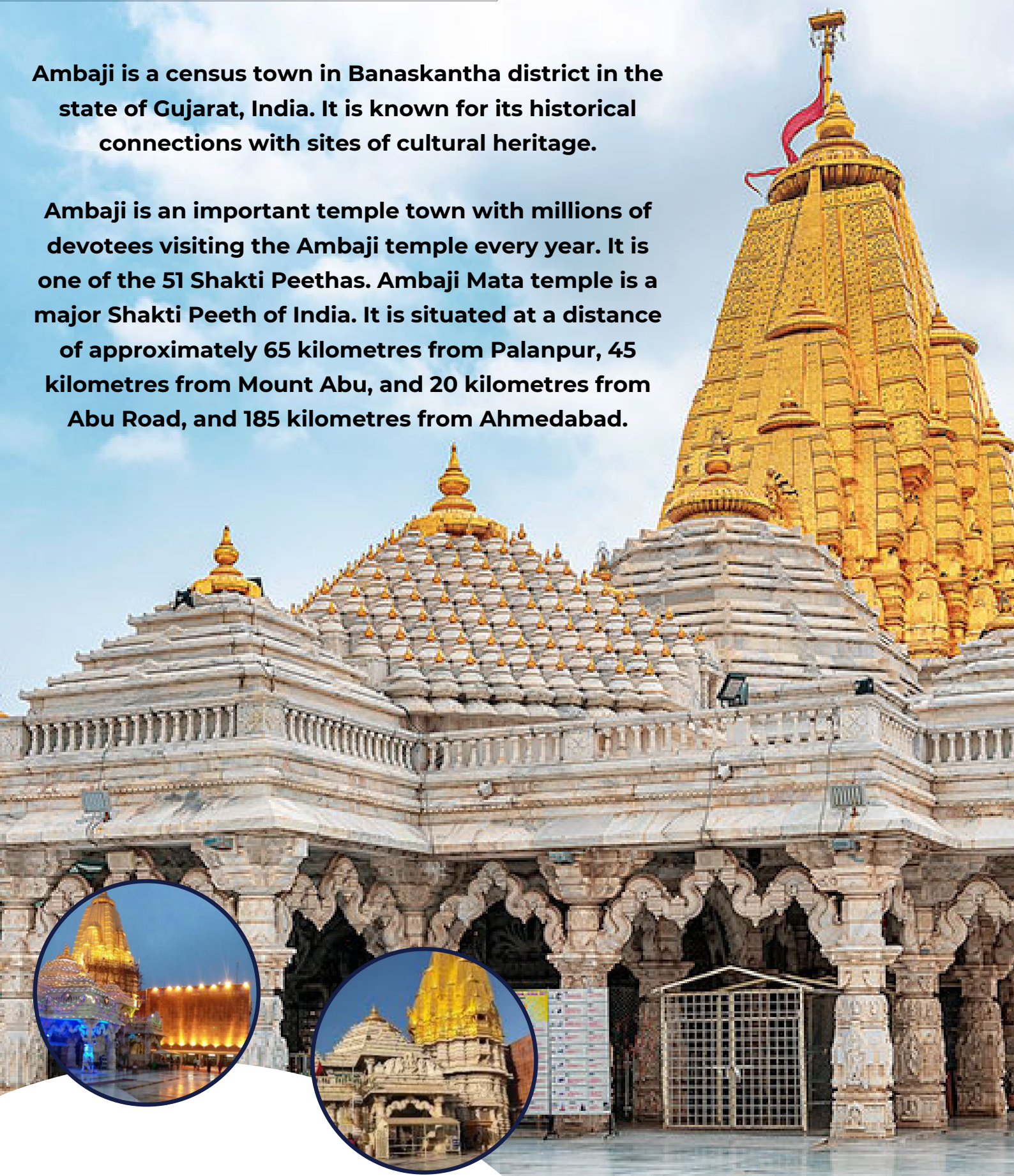
The Statue of Unity is a colossal statue of Indian statesman and independence activist Vallabhbhai Patel, who was the first Deputy Prime Minister and Home minister of independent India and adherent of Mahatma Gandhi during the non-violent Indian Independence movement.



AMBAJI TEMPLE

Ambaji is a census town in Banaskantha district in the state of Gujarat, India. It is known for its historical connections with sites of cultural heritage.

Ambaji is an important temple town with millions of devotees visiting the Ambaji temple every year. It is one of the 51 Shakti Peethas. Ambaji Mata temple is a major Shakti Peeth of India. It is situated at a distance of approximately 65 kilometres from Palanpur, 45 kilometres from Mount Abu, and 20 kilometres from Abu Road, and 185 kilometres from Ahmedabad.



MODHERA SUN TEMPLE



The Sun Temple is a Hindu temple dedicated to the solar deity Surya located at Modhera village of Mehsana district, Gujarat, India.

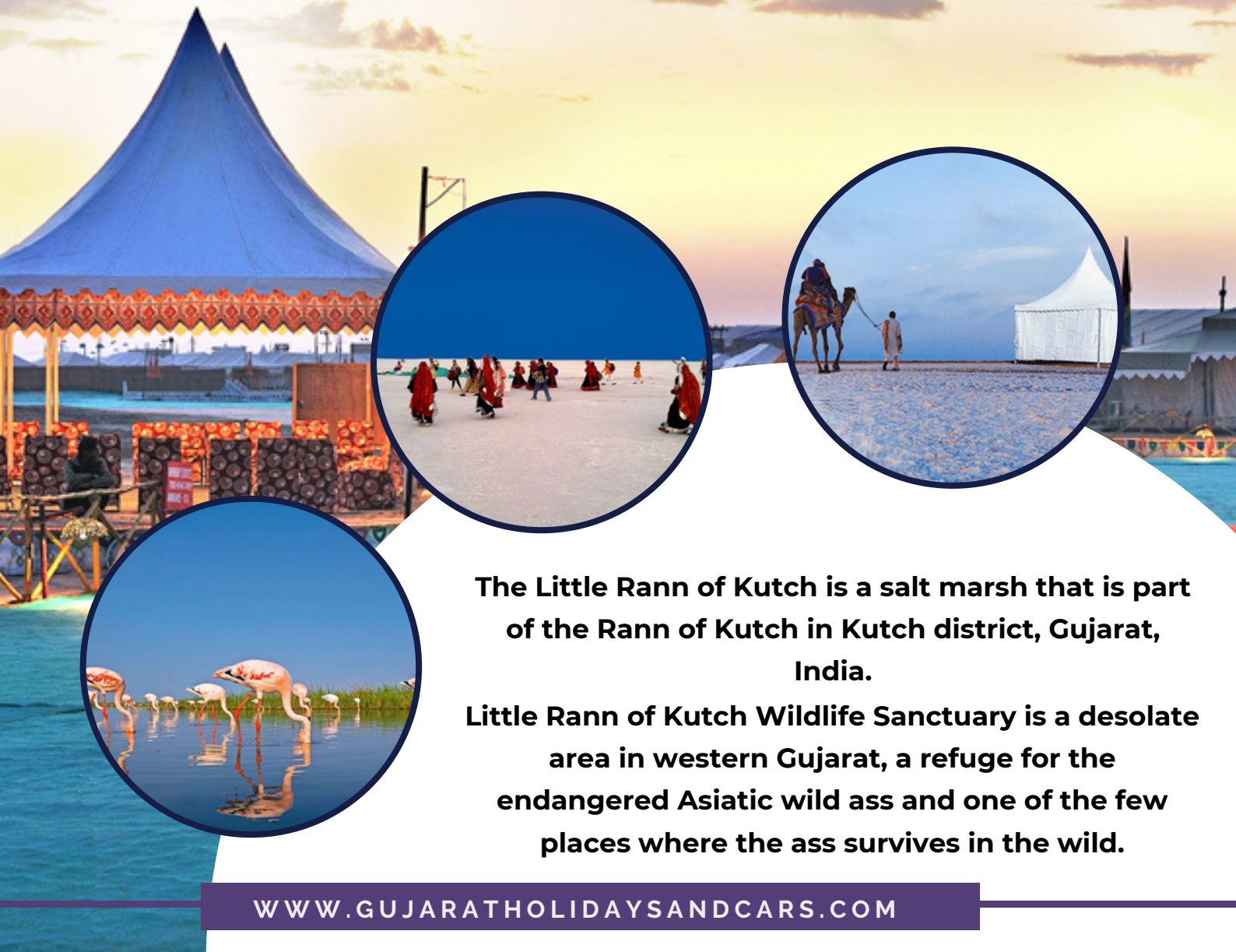
It is situated on the bank of the river Pushpavati. It was built after 1026-27 CE during the reign of Bhima I of the Chaulukya dynasty.

PATAN

LITTLE RANN OF KUTCH



The Little Rann of Kutch is a salt marsh that is part of the Rann of Kutch in Kutch district, Gujarat, India.

Little Rann of Kutch Wildlife Sanctuary is a desolate area in western Gujarat, a refuge for the endangered Asiatic wild ass and one of the few places where the ass survives in the wild.
